What?

The "Gender Justice Beyond Borders" - Migrant Youth Leadership Program (MYLP) is an initiative by WoW (With or Without) and the Center for Migration, Gender, and Justice (CMGI). The program trains migrant youth for collective action at the intersection of migration and gender.

Why?

In 2022, the MYLP focuses on migrant domestic workers (MDWs) in Europe within the framework of the International Labor Organization (ILO) Convention C190 on harassment and violence in the world of work. Women MDWs in Europe face high risk of labor and human right abuses - often with limited protections as less than 40% of all national labor laws globally protect domestic workers.

How?

The six-month program consists of three components (June - December 2022):

- Education: Online Course
- Research: Workshop Series
- Advocacy: Campaign Curation "16 Days of Activism against Gender-Based Violence"

Who?

Migrant youth (18-30 years) from across Europe are invited to participate in the program and will receive a stipend to support their engagement in the program. The program will be held in English and combines online and in-person participation (conditional to COVID-19 restrictions).
